

#### WARDENS REPORT

Easter seems a distant memory now, but it was an extremely successful period for Immanuel. Services over the period were; Mothering Sunday including distribution of daffodils (thank you to Marje for putting these together); The Palm Sunday procession and Café church which was enjoyed by all those attending with people especially impressed at the appearance of a donkey (see photos), thank you to all those who made this happen; followed by the Maundy Thursday Passover service and meal (personally I feel this is a gem which parishioners greatly enjoy once they attend) was held with several of our friends from St Francis attending Immanuel for this joint event; Stations of the Cross held at St Francis on Good Friday and finally Easter Sunday church was very well attended for our Easter Eucharist. The Easter cards again were generally well received by the parish.

This year the AGM will be held on Tuesday the 16th of May in the Upper Hall all parishioners are welcome.

Hopefully, we are going to see the warmer drier weather soon and this will allow us to recommence some of the external work required in and around the church. Please, please, please, volunteer to help those who give their time free of charge to save the church money. We have one of if not the most well looked after and best-looking churches in Blackburn with Darwen and we must ensure this continues.

To give people some perspective in 2022 the cost of running Immanuel Church was over £65,000 whilst the income from giving, fundraising and claiming back tax from Gift Aid amounted to just over £41,000 which is a deficit of £24,000!!! Without the income we receive from the hall Immanuel would not survive for long. Please sign up to both standing order monthly payment and Gift Aid if you are not already doing so. The church costs money all the time not just on the particular Sunday someone attends.

The proposed Narthex (paid for by an extremely generous legacy) at the rear of the church is progressing with the agreed design having been submitted for a faculty to the Diocese.

The consultation period with heritage and church building groups finishes on the 1st of May and shortly after the Diocesan Advisory Group will consider the scheme and once agreed we will publish the plans.

There are still a few stragglers from whom I need to collect monthly prize draw subscriptions and would remind people that there are still additional numbers available. *Winners March and April are 146 & 109*.

#### "MEMORIES!"

Memories are made from ... So the line goes from a popular song, as I remember, was sung by Dean Martin 1955. However, memories are strange, as time passes by you embellish some and some lie deep within the grey matter only to be awakened when some event unlocks the 'pigeon hole' within the brain. This article was brought about by a sermon in 'Cafe Church' when David our vicar asked, had any member of the congregation got an item that was precious and of little intrinsic value. This set my little grey cells turning over. As I think more and more of my memories, more and more events of the past are brought to the fore. As a dreamer and an engineer, I decided to categorise my memories into groups.

**Pleasant memories** - those evoked by photos and artefacts that we treasure

**Memories that are neutral** - things that you have learnt and stay with you forever.

**Unpleasant memories** - ones you wish you could irradicate but return to put shivers up your spine

#### **Modern Memories**

I will start with number one the pleasant memories. When David posed the question, I remembered the nappy safety pin I carry in my wallet. This little piece of bent wire with a safety clasp covering the sharp point conjures up memories of when our children



were very young (nearly 50 years ago) I was changing the 'Terry Toweling nappy' - no throw away nappies at this time. With Philip's little legs wriggling and the nappy folded into a triangle I proceeded to fasten the three peaks together with the infamous safety pin. Wriggling stopped suddenly the smile disappeared and a small spot of blood emerged. I had stuck the point of the safety pin into Philip! The pin is a memory of those early days as parents.

The second keep's sake is one that reminds me of the past but is also practical. In my teens a friend and I set off on an adventure – a week's holiday cycling around



the Lake District staying in youth Hostels (YHA). Neither of us had ever been out of sight of our parents before and for one week we would be FREE. The second day of our adventure we arrived at Coniston Copper Mines YHA. In those days domestic duties were a must, sneaking away before you had

assisted the Warden was not a done thing. David and I did a double duty as a result of some person who had escaped chores. For our willingness to assist, the YHA warden gave us each a fold up can opener. This little piece of bent metal, probably developed during WW2 has come to the rescue on many a family holiday when the caravan we were staying in lacked the vital tin opener.




Of the happy memories group is a string of coloured beads. Each bead is made form hard brightly coloured plastic held on nickel plated brass chain. My sister and I both cut our milk teeth on this teething device and so did our children. And happy memories we have of such times. Sadly, however, devices like these beads would not be permitted today the FPO

(Fun prevention Officer) would declare them a safety hazard as a child might bite through the brass chain with their tiny gums and then choke on the beads whilst we parent are distracted by some form of flashing, squeaking technology. Pleasant memories of a less complicated world.

Now for the next group of memories. Neutral memories for me are those which have been instilled in the mind only to be recalled on demand. For me most are associated with learning. Some people can remember the Ten Commandments, others a piece of poetry others the dates of famous historical events. A few bits of poetry stick in my memory banks 'The lady of Shalott' I have had to look up who wrote the poem and the date. However, it is not the poet nor the poem but the fact that our art teacher required each pupil in the class to paint a scene that the poem conjured in our mind. I did ok and came second to and incredible

young artist in our class. Another neutral event was the 'First man on the Moon' The date should be imprinted on my mind but I can't remember, but, I can remember that I stood with friends in the Beechwood Pub to watch the event semi live on 'The Colour TV' all our neighbours had small black and white TV's. For me it will be those mathematical formulae. Pythagoras theorem for right



angle triangles and how  $\pi$  (pi) relates to circles, Ohms Law and many others that have no emotional effect but sit there in my memory banks ready for action when called upon

Then come the horror memories these are the one that still evoke fear and night mares. When our children were at primary school, the three of us would go on a 'pudding walk' so called as it took place just after Christmas to walk off the over indulgence. This year was to be a trip to the summit of Ingleborough taking in



Gaping Gill crater. All was well. Philip and Rachel sat on the turf terrace (still at primary school) whilst I would have a closer look at the 98m (322ft) shaft the entrance to this incredible cave. now you might have guessed I slipped on a polished section of lime stone and stopped just a metre or so form edge. the have since descended many times to try

and cast off the memory of what would have happened had I not stopped. I hope none of you who are still reading this have memories like this.

Finally, a modern memory. Last month I received an envelope via our Vicar David. The envelope had travelled from Kilmarnock. The first question was who would write to me from Kilmarnock? The only people we know in Kilmarnock are our Son and Family. Why would they write via David? In the envelope was a card from a Mrs Shirley Donaldson whose son was christened at Immanuel 49 year ago. The kind lady reads the magazine which is posted to her from one of our parishioners. My article on light evoked memories of her past. I will keep this card from Shirley Donaldson in my box of keepsakes and perhaps when I am too dithery to write these article I will remember the kind words written.

At his point I will say - Thanks for putting up with my ramblings.



#### 3) Join the 100 Club; - ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS NOW DUE


