THE VICAR

Dear Friends

Most of you will know by now that after thirteen and a half happy years at Immanuel the time has come for me to move on to a new challenge. My final service at Immanuel was on Sunday 10th September and I will be inducted as vicar of St Michael and All Angels, Ashton on Ribble with St Mark, Preston on Sunday 8th October.

This is a decision which was not taken lightly and is one of those we sometimes have to take with mixed feelings. We will be very sad to leave Blackburn where our children have grown up and we have had so many great times. I personally will be very sorry to leave Immanuel where I have had the privilege of being the parish priest, got to know so many fantastic people, some of whom are no longer here, and enjoyed many rich and rewarding relationships. Like many before me the time came to make a decision to spend the rest of my ministry with you or, having reached a point in my career (60 next year) that if I were to move it had to be round about now. I saw that a parish for which I thought I might be suited had come up and I decided to make the application and the rigorous interview process (an hour's grilling by a panel of ten senior diocesan people) a process of discernment - if so many others agreed with where I thought that God might be calling me, then he surely is. As a result although it is with sadness that we are leaving Immanuel it is also with a sense of excitement and anticipation that I am looking forward to the next chapter of where God is leading. As I must have said on many occasions Christian discipleship is I think not so much doing God's work for him on this earth but in sharing in what God is already doing - and the deep sense of fulfilment that this brings and which I have been so blessed to have enjoyed these last thirteen and a half years.

According to the Book of Genesis, Abraham was 75 years old when God called him from his home in Haran and to journey to the land of Canaan. Many might have thought he'd done enough by that, uprooting himself at that age. But no, when he was at the ripe old age of 99, we are told, God said to Abraham "Between you and Me I will establish my covenant, and I will multiply you

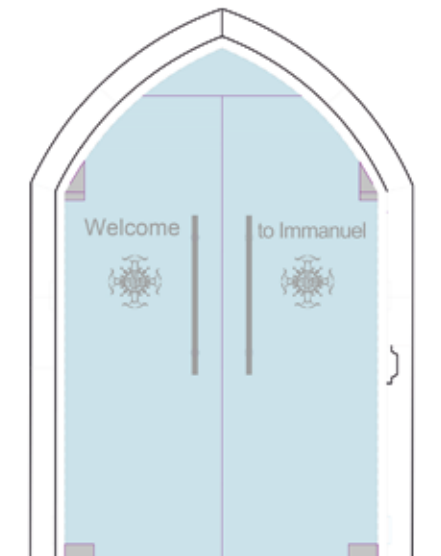
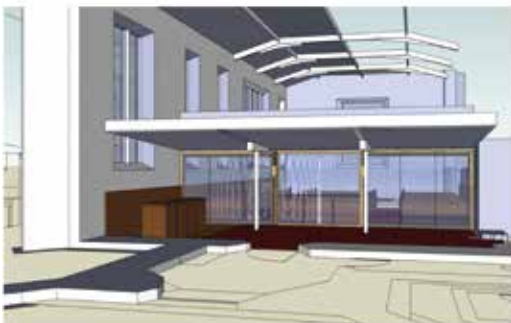
exceedingly. My covenant is this: you are to become the father of a host of nations." Hope for us all then, it makes me a spring chicken! But notice the key point: "Between you and me", Abraham was being called to share in God's work, not to do it all himself. By being willing to share in what God was already doing, by answering God's call God's will was to be done and look at what has been achieved over the centuries by God's people as a result.

I hope that as many of you as possible can come to my induction on 8th October, there is a list up in Church to sign for catering numbers if you will be coming or you could just message me. I'm not travelling as far as Abraham, only 20 minutes away, you will always be welcome at our new home and we'd be only too pleased to see you whenever you happen to find yourself in Preston. It has been the privilege of my life to have been your priest. You will always be in my prayers and I am sure that God will bless you richly in the future as you begin the process of finding a new vicar.

In addition, we are moving forward with the Narthex and new internal doors and impressions of the church with these is included below.

(A mix of Friendships)



Often, we talk of friendship and don't give much thought to the extent of the meaning. We just use the phrase to convey a relationship. David our vicar mentioned friendship to me and for some reason it triggered one of my two grey cells to think what do we want friendship to mean. Typically, as a semi-retired engineer I decided to categorise as many meanings or feelings that the word conveys.

- Someone you send a card to at Christmas or birthdays. An annual reconnection with a friend or colleague from the past.
- A person you met at school or college and remain in close contact. Meeting them on a regular basis to catch up with news and gossip.
- A lasting marriage where a difference of opinion is put behind you and another day starts afresh.
- When grand-children become part of your life.
- When a person becomes a friend because they or you feel you can ask of them or confide in them.
- Perhaps someone you have known for years passes away and not till then, did you realise what a friend they had been to you.

The list could go on as I'm sure you all have definitions of friendship especially when words are difficult to find to express what you feel.

Photographs are memory provokers. They don't have words, perhaps a brief note to help catch the moment. It is the power of the image that brings back memories of a snap shot of a time past.

I have reached a point in my ramblings where I find it hard to separate friendship from happiness as happy moments appear to be linked to those moment when you are with friends.

Many of you will know I enjoy walking, especially the hills and even more so if I can find open access land, no paths just D.I.Y. Oscar our number 2 grandson and I, when out walking, will encounter people we have never met before and unlikely to meet again yet we always pass with a cheery word or more. Oscar counts the snippets of conversation and has noted how friendly people are who you have never met before. Our most recent outing was to conker the summit of the Lakeland peak 'Catstye Cam' We approached this perfect summit from the big dam in 'Kepple Cove' and then take the steepest approach a walker can make. All the way up Oscar's Dad and I were controlling expletives as knees ache and the sun beats down with relentless disrespect. As pain on knees grew, Oscar issues instructions of safety. As we summit out and take a recovery break there is a united feeling of satisfaction and friendship – 'We made it' – three men stand on the edge ready to go over the top. We meet other walkers who have come from Helvellyn. We exchange a few words and trust each other with expensive cameras and phones to capture that moment – a memory for the future.

One thing about hill 'bagging' is when at the summit all directions are down. This brings me to the 11th November a little time ago – Remembrance Sunday. All over the country and beyond people gather to remember those who gave their lives for our peace. However, the most moving of these acts of Remembrance I have attended takes place on the summit of Great Gable. You have to set off early morning to guarantee a parking spot from which to attack this hill. People of every walk of life emerge from what appears nowhere and gather at the summit of Great Gable to offer respect to those who have





fallen in war. Assisted by two stalwarts, a vicar is led to the rocky pinnacle just above the bronze plaque commemorating lost lives. There is a friendship brought by this act of worship as people stand or sit and ignore the weather. Perhaps this is the closest today that I could experience the atmosphere that is described in the Bible – Sermon and the Mount.

You have climbed hills trod paths and negotiated moorland slopes and you have to descend to the valley floor 'cars don't do off-road very well'. You meet more and more people who will speak to you with confidence about their exhausting experience. At this point I ask myself why in the open country you can chat to people you have never met



before, whilst in towns and cities you avoid them, even averting one's eye contact. Having descended from Dale Head and Robinson pike via Cat Bells and along the shore line of Derwent Water, there lies a sculpture 'The hand of Friendship'. When I see this single wooden hand polished to an antique patina by the bums of many passersby, I think of all the good times and the people we have met

on the summit of hills ready to go over the top as you part with a cheery word. For those of you who might have stood on Dale Head you will know of the exposure. These hills have no shelter from any point on the compass and when the weather turns wet, you have to be prepared and think a 'bad day on the fells is always better than a good day in the office' On one such an occasion my friend and I met a couple caught out by the unpredictable weather and ask "How do we find our way off back to the car"? "Where is the car parked?" we asked as they pointed into the low cloud and mist. Looking at the map (no batteries required). We were able to make a good estimate of the car's location, gave them one of our waterproof maps and set them off with directions for the quickest safe descent to the road and hopefully the car. The young couple expressed enormous gratitude for what – a piece of laminated paper, or was it a friendly pair of walkers they didn't expect to meet?

If you have an interest that gets you out and meeting strangers perhaps a cheery word and a friendly smile might just plant a memory in the pigeon holes of the brain and when you recall this memory you might just have made someone's day.

3) Join the 100 Club; - ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS NOW DUE

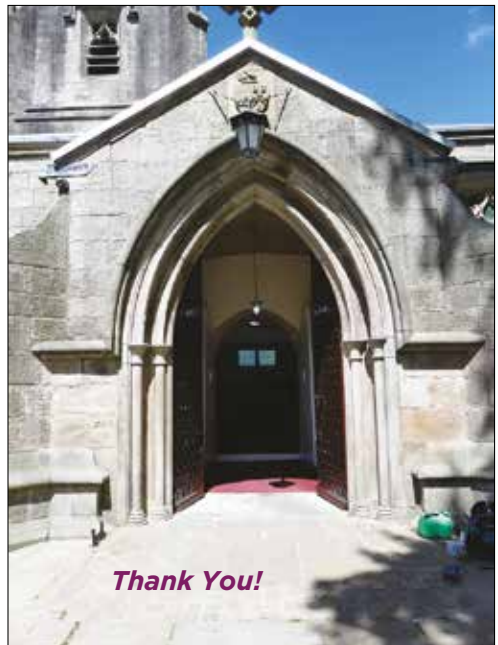
